Melbourne Private's Fellowship Program offers many opportunities for undergraduate nurses. Some reasons you might consider joining are:

- Fellowship students settle into placement more quickly because they are familiar with the hospital and are always supported.

- Third year Fellowship students may rotate through the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), Operating Theatres, Day Procedure and Oncology Units.
- Final year Fellowship Students both local and international are guaranteed an interview for our Graduate Nurse Program (GNP).
- Over 75% of our Fellowship Students transition into our Graduate Program.

Level 5: Cardiology

Level 5 is a 38 bed Cardiac ward inclusive of a 4 bed Coronary Care Unit. The patients on Level 5 are generally admitted for treatment and/ or investigation of cardiac disorders. Patients recovering from massive cardiothoracic surgeries such Coronary Artery Bypass are transferred to Level 5 directly from our Intensive Care Unit.

Students assigned to Level 5 can expect to develop their 12 lead ECG recording and interpretation skills, and expertise in management of patients post Coronary Angiograms, Stents and TAVIs.

Level 6: Medical and Surgical

Level 6 is a 32-bed unit providing nursing care to patients with a wide range of medical and surgical conditions. The medical component of the ward includes oncology and gastroenterology. The surgical component includes patients undergoing urological, colorectal and orthopaedic surgery as well as renal transplantation.

Students assigned to Level 6 can expect to care for a variety of patients immediately post-surgery. Students will learn how to manage IV pumps, PCA infusions and remove surgical drains.

Level 8: Neurosurgical

Level 8 is a 30-bed unit providing nursing care to patients with a wide range of neuro-surgical conditions. The unit is divided into 24 ward beds and a 6 bed High Dependency Unit (HDU).

Students assigned to Level 8 can expect to learn how to care for patients post brain and/ or spine surgery in the HDU. They will also gain proficiency in changing complex dressings and performing neurological assessments.
